Guillermo del Toro: Crafting Pinocchio

Opening with classic and contemporary editions and interpretations of Pinocchio from around the world, the exhibition includes production art, props, and a look at the various phases of puppet-making. Working film sets from del Toro's movie, motion tests, and time-lapse video installa-

tions document the complex stop-motion process that brings the story's characters to life. The exhibition concludes with an immersive installation.

Nick Cave: Forothermore

Nick Cave (b. 1959, Fulton, Missouri) has become internationally celebrated for his elaborate installations and textile works, including his iconic Soundsuits, which blend sculpture, costume design, and instrument-making. Forothermore is a survey exhibition covering the entire breadth of the artist's career, and it will feature sculpture, installation, video, and rarely seen early works. The title is a neologism, a new word that reflects the artist's lifelong commitment to creating space for those who feel marginalized by dominant society and culture.
